## Year 3 Focus

This term has been a really lovely term for class 3 and we are all now well and truly settled in to our new class and school routines.

Some of the exciting things we have been doing include electing new school councillors and Eco councillors to represent our class, using this as an opportunity to discuss voting and being a part of a democracy, which linked nicely to our first History topic, all about The Ancient Greeks.



In English we started the term by continuing to make links to our History lesson and studied the Greek Myth 'Theseus and the Minotaur.' As well as writing a description of our own Mythical creature, we also wrote some interesting explanation texts about insects, which we also learnt about in science.



We conducted an interesting investigation in science, in the early part of the term, about the damage certain drinks do to the enamel on our teeth and in art we have enjoyed researching architecture, looking at the work of Sir Christopher Wren, and sketching our own buildings, ensuring they are symmetrical.



As well as our usual art sessions the children also took part in Christmas Arts and crafts and had a lovely fun filled afternoon, listening to Christmas music and creating lots of Christmassy decorations. We have noticed a real improvement in the presentation of all the children's work, handwriting is flourishing and we are extremely pleased to see an increasing number of children working to get as many reading raffles tickets as they can.
