

Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2018/19

Eligibility and funding amounts

The pupil premium is a grant given to schools to close the attainment gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers. It is also used to support pupils with parents in the armed forces; this part of it is also known as the service premium). Academies receive money for each pupil of compulsory school age pupil who fits the eligibility criteria. There are categories and amounts of funding are as follows:

Pupils recorded as 'ever 6 free school meals (FSM) £1300 Looked After Children £2300 Service Premium £300

The academy's funding for 2018/19 is £63,360

Monitoring Pupil Premium Funding

The academy will allocate funds to improve the attainment of eligible pupils. Throughout the year, this expenditure and pupil progress will be closely monitored in order to ensure funds are used effectively.

Barriers to Achievement

- 1. More able children not enthused or supported to ensure that they have a desire to achieve to the best of their ability
- 2. Middle and low ability children have insufficient support to ensure they achieve their full potential
- 3. Financial hardships
- 4. Social, emotional and mental health difficulties that children are experiencing
- 5. Attendance below national (96%)
- 6. Low aspirations
